COVID-19/Coronavirus: Force of Nature is on EPA's list of disinfectants approved for use against SARS-CoV-2, the cause of COVID-19. Force of Nature has demonstrated effectiveness against viruses similar to COVID-19 on hard, non-porous surfaces. Therefore, Force of Nature can be used against COVID-19 when used in accordance with the directions for use against Norovirus on hard non-porous surfaces. Refer to the CDC website for additional information. To secure federal EPA registration, a product is tested using EPA required anti-microbial testing protocols over multiple lots. Suppliers, purity, concentration & processing of all individual ingredients have to be approved, with strict statistical limits on all.

### **What are the usage directions for disinfecting?**

We're glad you asked because a lot of people don't know the proper way to use disinfectants (not just Force of Nature)! On hard, non-porous surfaces, clean surface of soil or residue so that the disinfectant can come into contact with 100% of the surface. Spray Force of Nature on surface until thoroughly wet. Allow surface to remain wet for 10 minutes. Let dry or wipe surface with clean cloth or towel. Most people don't realize that the disinfectants you buy at the store typically have a 10 minute dwell time, and that you need to pre-clean the surface. No matter what disinfectant you use, don't forget to read the usage instructions carefully.

#### **Disinfection of Hard, Non-Porous Surfaces using Force of Nature Final Solution Spray:**

To Clean and Disinfect and Deodorize Hard Non-Porous Surface: Pre-clean surface. Spray Force of Nature disinfecting solution on surface until thoroughly wet. Allow surface to remain wet for 10 minutes. Wipe surface with clean cloth or towel or let air dry.
